



Ebey Waterfront Park and Shoreline Access Project

Project Background

The Ebey Waterfront Trail project represents a significant improvement by the City of Marysville to improve its image by developing a regional destination that will connect users with shoreline access to the newly restored Qwuloolt Estuary and the Ebey Slough waterfront. The project also aims to support economic redevelopment of the Marysville's Downtown.

The City is seeking funding to fully support the Ebey Waterfront Master Trail System.

Estimated Cost: \$4M



Improvements

The first phase of the trail project is nearing completion, which includes the construction of a paved asphalt trail along Ebey Slough (shown in red above). This phase was funded in part by the City and a grant from the Aquatic Land Enhancement Account (ALEA).

Project support is needed to complete the remaining trail segments (shown in green). The City has budgeted beginning in 2017, \$3 million, towards the project. Additional funding is needed to complete the trail with the vision set forth in the City's Master Plan and for the Waterfront Park and Trail.

The City will continue to seek funding through other sources such as the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program (WWRP), Aquatic Land Enhancement Account (ALEA), and Land Water Conservation Funding (LWCF).
